OUTCOME OF THE PROGRAM:

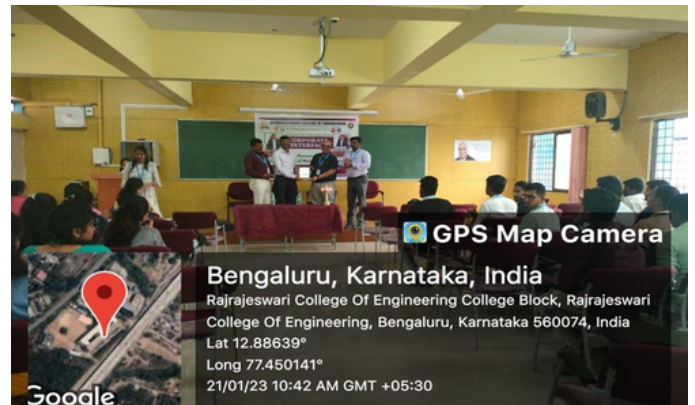

- Students improved flexibility and strength through which yoga stretches their muscles.



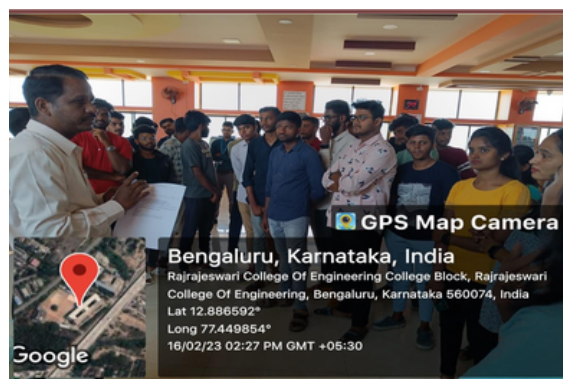
