Annual Training Camp (ATC) for SD/SW Naval Cadets

National Cadet Corps (NCC) is a voluntary organization helping India in Nation-building. The aim of NCC is to develop leadership character, infusing the values of patriotism, commandership, team spirit, discipline, self-confidence, hard work, dignified outlook, spirit of adventure, sportsmanship, ideals of selfless service among the youth of the country and promote overall personality development. NCC creates a resource of organized, well trained and fully motivated youth to provide leadership in all walks of life and always be ready to service our nation. Also provide a suitable environment for the motivated youth to take up a career in the Armed Forces (Army, Navy or in Air force).

During the course of the training period, cadets are posted to various camps across India and abroad to inculcate team spirit, leadership quality, understand life style on the go during the camp. Many camps are organized to push the cadets' limits by extreme training and other activities. Few camps for example are Basic Leadership Camp (BLC), Advance Leadership Camp (ALC), Army Attachment Camp (AAC), Combined Annual Training Camps (CATC), Hiking and Trekking Camps, Thal Sainik Camp (TSC), Vayu Sainik Camp (VSC), Nau Sainik Camp (NSC), Rock Climbing Camps (RCC), Youth Exchange Program (YEP), Waterman ship camp (WSC), etc. 1 Kar Naval Unit NCC at Rajarajeswari College of Engineering is functioning under **1 Kar Naval Unit, Bengaluru Group 'A'** with total strength of 50 cadets.

It was a privilege to host **Annual Training Camp (ATC)** at RRCE for the first time and that to within 3 months from the raising day ceremony of the Unit. When the unit received letter from CO office to host ATC, our Magnanimous Management agreed without any second thought.

Annual Training Camp (ATC) was held at **Rajarajeswari College of Engineering, Bengaluru** within the state under the aegis of **Karnataka & Goa Directorate**. The duration of this camp was **10 days** from **10th Nov to 19th Nov 2021** exclusive for NCC cadets (SD & SW) which was held within the **1 Kar Naval Units NCC**. The main focus of this camp is to develop **personality development** and get a **glimpse of military camp training**.

Camp strength was 194 cadets, 10 ANO's, 6 PI staffs, 4 office staff with commanding Officer. Total strength of 214 members were present for the 10 days camp. During ATC camp the cadets participated in different activities like weapon training, obstacle, map reading, essay writing, Volleyball competition and Debate competition.

Associate NCC Officer was the contingent leader. All the activities were carried out under his command. Tough schedule was followed by all the participants in the camp. The daily schedule was provided by the camp head on the daily basis. It was a big and important part of that 10 days camp. 10 days schedule in short:-

Annual Training Camp is a platform where cadets are taught various subjects such as drill, weapon training, map reading, first aid, adventure, self-defence, military history, naval subject like different types of war ships, escape boats, ship building, physical fitness, field craft and battle craft.

Day – 01: (10/11/2021)

Cadets from various colleges across Bengaluru were asked to report by 8:00am at RRCE grounds. Biometric attendance was a mandatory process followed by NCC unit. All cadets were asked to get accommodate in their respective hostels (boys and girls separate).

Inaugural function of ATC (10 days) camp was organized by RRCE in welcoming CO Sir, PI staffs, ANOs, office staffs and all the cadets. Drill classes were conducted to the cadets till afternoon. Post lunch cadets were asked to attend technical classes regarding boat and ship. Evening cadets were allowed to take part in sports activities.

Day – 02: (11/11/2021)

Started the day with the routine PT and drill to the cadets from 5:00am to till 6:30am followed by breakfast and tea till 7:15am. All the cadets were asked to fall in by 8:00am to start the drill classes. After drill classes, technical classes regarding ships, boats, etc were handled by the PI staff and CO Sir.

Day – 03: (12/11/2021)

Started with the routine PT and drill for the cadets from 5:00am to till 6:30am followed by breakfast and tea till 7:15am. Drill and technical training was carried out.

Day – 04 (13/11/2021)

Due to heavy rain only technical class regarding ships and boats were taken to the cadets. Knowledge about various ship, warships, etc was conducted by PI staff.

Day – 05 (14/11/2021) and Day – 06: (15/11/2021)

Day started with the routine PT and drill for the cadets from 5:00am to till 6:30am followed by breakfast and tea till 7:15am. All the cadets were asked to report to the firing range by 7:45am that was held at (ACSCE grounds). Cadets were given sufficient training on rifle drill and technical information about the do's and don'ts of the firing process. 0.22mm rifle was used and cadets were briefed about the complete information and understanding of rifles, its parts, different positions of firing, safety precautions that is mandatory to follow. The instructor informed the cadets to hold rifles, obey commands, etc.

NCC teaches overall development in this regard, special class was organized to understand the basic of fire safety rules and first aid. Cadets were given demonstration and hands on experience to build the tents at the camp site to increase cadets knowledge and make them feel competitive so that they can give their best in every field. Swatch Bharath (cleanliness) event was also held to encourage the cadets to keep their surrounding neat and clean. Flag Area competition was also organized. Cadets from 7 colleges participated.
